

CMS WILL BEGIN SENDING NEW MEDICARE CARDS IN APRIL 2018

MACRA has mandated the removal of the SSN-based HICN from Medicare cards to reduce the risk of beneficiary identity theft. In accordance with this mandate, CMS will begin mailing new Medicare cards beginning in April 2018. The new cards will use the Medicare Beneficiary Identifier (MBI), a randomly generated alphanumeric ID that contains no identifying information about the beneficiary, such as the Social Security number.

Why is this important?

MedInformatix currently has a feature designed to validate the current SSN+A/B/D/N format. By April 1st, 2018, all customers who use MedInformatix for billing purposes, or to maintain insurance information, should update to version 7.6.8.0 or newer to support validation of the new ID. While ID validation can be disabled, this procedure is not recommended since the billing process eventually will require the new ID number. In addition to the updated validation, it is now easier to copy existing Medicare information into new coverage by clicking the new 'Replace' button located on the Patient's Insurance Information screen.



Important Dates

- April 1st, 2018: Transition period begins. Medicare will start sending out new Medicare cards with the MBI to beneficiaries.
 Medicare will accept both the HICN and the MBI.
- March 31st, 2019: New Medicare card mailing completed. By approximately this date, CMS will have mailed new Medicare cards
 to all beneficiaries.
- December 31st, 2019: Transition period ends. Last service date to submit a new claim with a HICN.
- January 1st, 2020: MBI must be used for all service dates after this date. Exceptions include appeals for pre-1/1/2020 claims billed with the HICN, some reports, and span date claims.

• HICN: Health Insurance Claim Number (current Medicare ID)

2018 QPP FINAL RULE

On November 2, 2017, CMS released the Quality Payment Program (QPP) final rule for the 2018 performance year. In addition, they have issued an interim final rule that addresses extreme and uncontrollable circumstances that MIPS eligible clinicians may face because of widespread catastrophic events affecting a region or area in calendar year (CY) 2017 -- the year QPP began implementation. This final rule provides updates for the second and future years of the Quality Payment Program. These requirements remain complex, but thanks to more flexibility and higher exemption requirements, they will assist practices for year 3 readiness. Here's a high-level summary of what you need to know:

- · More Clinicians can skip MIPS
- · Small Practices get a break
- You can prepare now (less than 2 months to adjust before reporting starts on January 1, 2018)
- · Payment tracks remain (mostly) the same (MIPS & APMs)
- MIPS category weights changed from proposed rule mainly cost from 0 to 10%
- Integration of Quality Payment Program: MIPS connecting quality, improvement activities, advancing care information (ACI) and resource use (cost)
- Full year reporting on Quality Categories
- Can use both 2014 or 2015 EHR technology (incentives for use of 2015)
- · More difficult to avoid a penalty
- Introduces Virtual Groups
- Addresses hurricanes and other natural disasters for CY 2017 and CY 2018

This final rule creates a whole new framework to drive providers to value-based care. Medical practices need to understand and prepare for this complex mandate, or suffer penalties into the foreseeable future.




MEDINFORMATIX TIPS AND TRICKS

Quick Tip:

How to change your fonts

- 1. Preferences and Fonts > Workflow View Fonts > Font: select desired font, style and size.
- 2. Log out and close MedInformatix.
- 3. Log back in to see changes.






Coming Up in v7.7.0.0

The preferred font can be set for workflow views and billing screens with the same setting.




Selecting more than one book in Appointment List

ENABLE APPT LIST VIEW - MULTIPLE BOOKS

The Workgroup Profile setting to enable this feature: Section [DIM], Appt List Multiple Books=1 (0=off)

Access the Appointment List by clicking on Views (top left-hand side) in the Workflow Views screen, and by selecting Appointment List.


- 1. Click the Book(s) button to open the Select Appointment Book(s) screen
- Select the book(s) from the Select Appointment Book(s) screen, by highlighting the desired book(s) and using the left arrow to place the book(s) in the Book Selection List.
 - Use the Appt Group and Facility dropdown to filter through the available options;
 - To remove the book(s) from the Book Selection List highlight the book and click the right arrow
- 3. Click Select to see your selections displayed in the Appointment List



Understanding the Unsigned View


TEXT DOCUMENTS

- For the Unsigned View, if the document is a text file, double-clicking opens the "Edit Chart Document" screen. This is not the Document Repository, but it will allow you to edit the document before signing. Or click the "View Document" button from the Unsigned View.
- In the Unsigned View, click on the folder icon to open the Chart.
- If you are reviewing a text file and want to go to the Chart, exit this screen and click the folder icon in the Unsigned View.
- Alternatively, click on the folder icon in the "Edit Chart Document" screen to go to the Document Repository. At the bottom of this screen there is a "Go to Tree" button that takes you to the Chart when you exit the Repository.



PDF DOCUMENTS/FORMS

- For PDF forms, double-clicking will instead take you directly to the Document Repository to edit and/or sign the PDF document.
- To open the chart from the Repository, click the "Go to Tree" button to open the Chart when you exit the Repository.
- In the Unsigned View, click on the folder icon to open the Chart.
